You should have received an invitation to the ProCare app. If you are not on the app, please have your PIN ready. If you experience any issues, staff will be there to assist you. Please allow for a few extra moments for this process. Bring your ID with you the first few days as we get to know names and faces.

A few more operational details: Morning parking is available along Roselawn near the blacktop. Afternoon parking is available in the side lot off Washington Road and on Roselawn by the blacktop. Walk down the steps to B-4 and you will need to ring the doorbell to gain access to the program center, which is in Washington's cafeteria.
