Our Center spotlight will focus on a center that has embraced our culture of Respect, Open Communication and FUN (friendly, understanding and nurturing environment).

November spotlight is on Foster.

Foster is led Center Director, Chelsea Kirkpatrick and supported by staff, Cory Riddle and Debbie Molinari.


Foster recently had a **Mad Science reward day!** They started the day with a mad science "show" put on by Chelsea and Debbie where kids got to watch and participate in science experiments. Debbie made a pumpkin volcano that was especially exciting! Then everyone got to make their own slime.

The day ended with a "Static Electricity Race" led by Cory in a lab coat, where kids had to create static electricity by rubbing a balloon and then use the electricity they generated to move a metal can without touching it.

Outstanding Activities





Shout out to centers for incorporating calm activities into their center. These are especially helpful with the busy holiday season approaching. Check out:

Foster- Calm Down Corner (yoga mat/pillows), books, calm music, breathing activities, sensory activities (ex. Playdough, kinetic sand, etc.)

Hoover- Created a designated mindfulness area with a carpet and cushions, soft lighting, access to fidgets, calming music

KC Hoover- Guided meditation, lights off mindful moments, cosmic yoga, breathing activities

Howe- Uses soft lighting, fidgets reading area, glitter jars

KC Howe- Quiet area with squishies and fidgets, and breathing exercises

Jefferson- Calm music, books, and alone time

Lincoln- Listening to audio stories with headphones, puzzles, sensory putty, and fidget toys

KC Lincoln- Yoga, coloring, read aloud books, playdough, and squishy toys

Markham – Created designated areas for calm activities (coloring, reading). Uses breathing activities, calm music, dim lights, fidgets, and a "ruff day" jar.

Washington- Uses a matted area for reading/relaxing, large book selection and lighted décor to encourage a positive vibes

Calming activities recognize that all children have different needs and interests. Giving them calming choices helps them to recognize their needs and manage those needs to function well.
